




### **Annual Report now available**

### **National News - White Paper**

The long-awaited Schools White Paper, which was due to set out the Government's planned reforms to the special educational needs and disabilities (SEND) system, has been delayed until 2026.

Minister for School Standards, Georgia Gould is hosting nine face-to-face events, run in partnership with the Council for Disabled Children, and five online events covering the department's five principles of reform. At the events parents, families and the sector will be able to share their views. The first event took place in Bristol on 2 December 2026. ## **Spotlight: Information and Advice Officer**

This issue highlights the key role of an Information and Advice Officer. Angela, a Senior Information, Advice and Support Officer, shares insights into a typical week.



# Angela – Senior Information, Advice and Support Officer

As a Senior Information, Advice and Support Officer, I spend most of my time supporting and empowering parent and carers with the knowledge and confidence they need to navigate the complex and often difficult world of special educational needs and disabilities (SEND).

My week, and days start with checking emails and messages from parents, carers, and professionals. Each situation is individual/unique – from how to access SEN support, write parental Education Health and Care (EHC) needs assessment requests, understanding Education, Health and Care Plans (EHCPs) to clarifying appeal/tribunal processes. Recently, I supported a parent preparing for a tribunal hearing, helping them understand their rights and what evidence they needed to present. Another aspect of my role is supporting the team to manage workloads, prioritise referrals, and ensure that parents/carers receive timely contact with the appropriate person.

Much of my time is spent on calls and meetings, listening carefully to concerns and offering clear, impartial advice. It's about helping people feel heard and supported as well as answering specific questions. I have supported a parent all the way from an EHC needs assessment request to reviewing a draft EHCP as well as having guided a parent through the steps to request additional support in school. I also liaise with schools, local authorities, and other agencies to make sure everyone is working towards the best outcomes for the child or young person.

Every day is different. It is so rewarding seeing a parent/carer feel more confident, or understanding their child's rights, reminds me why this role is so important.
